June 26, 1939 - April 28, 2019

Barbara Jean Warren (nee Taylor) passed away in Winterville, NC on April 28th after a series of debilitating strokes.

She was born in Houston, TX on June 26, 1939 to the late Rev. Dr. Richard J. Taylor and Mary Ella Taylor (nee Tyler).

In 1957, after graduating high school in Junction City, KS, she married Carlee Warren, Sr. who predeceased her and from whom she was divorced at the time of her death.

Together they had three children; Parthenia (deceased), Carlee Jr., and Priscilla.

She was active in the Church of God where her father was pastor and she played piano and the organ in addition to singing.

In the late 1960s Barbara and her husband started a retail business that they ran successfully for the next 13 years in RI and MA.

Barbara was a deeply engaged and progressive parent to her children, instilling in them a sense of duty, commitment to service to others and her deep faith.

An accomplished musician, she served as the Minister of Music for churches in RI as well as performing with a gospel group in her spare time. Among their performances was an appearance at the RI State House for civil rights icon Rosa Parks. Barbara retired from FEDEX after working as a Customer Service Agent in Providence, RI for over a decade and moved to Ayden, NC where she spent the remainder of her life.

She is survived by her son, Carlee; her daughter, Priscilla; granddaughter Koya; grandson, Tristan; her great-grandson, Jeremiah; nieces, nephews, a host of relatives and friends.

Barbara Warren will be as missed as she was deeply loved by all who knew her.

There will be a celebration of her life to be held in Rhode Island in June.
