



Elder Floyd Lee Clemons Jr.

August 12, 1947 - November 19, 2012

Elder Floyd Clemons, Jr. (known as “PeeBoy”) went to Heaven on the afternoon of November 19, 2012 in Jamaica Plains, Massachusetts. He was the second child of thirteen children born in Pactolus, N.C. to Floyd Lee Clemons, Sr. and the late Mattie Mae Sherman Clemons on August 12, 1947.

He attended Bethel Union High School. From Pactolus, the family moved to Greenville, NC in 1964. He later returned to Pactolus to live with his grandfather and grandmother Hezekiah and Minnie Clemons. He attended East Carolina University and worked at Walter B. Jones Alcohol and Drug Abuse Treatment Center before moving to Boston, Massachusetts.

While in Boston, he lived with his Aunt Ruth for a short time. He then moved into the home of Pastor Julia Manning where he attended Harvard University. He was employed by Bournewood Hospital in Brookline, Massachusetts, where he counseled young adolescents.

After years of engaging in the pleasures of the world, he finally joined Manning Temple Holy Church of Love, formerly known as Holy Church on the Rock, where he served and loved God until he left for Heaven. He was ordained as a Deacon and later a Minister under the leadership of Pastor Betty Murray. Elder Clemons served well in all areas of the church. He was a Sunday School teacher, Bible Study teacher and minister of music. He ministered for a number of years holding revivals for Holy Church on the Rock and Noah’s Ark. He possessed a quiet and meek spirit like his mother and

wisdom like his father. He didn't talk much at all, but was very observant in matters of the church.

Preceded in Heaven before him was his mother, Mattie Mae Sherman Clemons and brother, Hezekiah C. Clemons. Remaining behind him to share his memories are his father, Floyd Lee Clemons, Sr. (Delores); Brothers: Dennis Marvin Clemons (Brenda), Clifton Ray Clemons, Melvin Clemons (Cathy), Gary Leon Clemons, Jan Keith Clemons and Derek Clemons (Kim); Sisters: Peggy Lee Hardison (Kelly), Annie Faye Davis (Mickey), Linda Ruth Clemons, Madeline Yvonne Purvis and Rosa Lisa Clemons; Special friends: Crista Whitehead, Jean and Timothy Talbot; and a host of nephews, nieces, family and loved ones.
