“ I had the distinct privilege of serving on Active Duty in the US Air Force with Harry. We were both stationed at Hickam Air Force Base, Hawaii, and we had a very demanding mission. Hickam Airways provided oceanic flight following for all US Military aircraft transiting the Pacific Ocean and flying within the Honolulu Flight Information Region. Harry was the consummate professional in this critical role. He expertly copied position reports from military aircraft, and he provided them with Air Traffic Control clearances that enabled the aircraft to change altitudes or direction. A single wrong word could end in tragedy, but Harry ensured that never happened on his tour of duty.

In addition to these demanding flight following duties, Harry also broadcasted Emergency Action Messages on a daily basis to the United States Nuclear Triad. These coded messages enabled the National Command Authority (The President & Secretary of Defense) with 100 percent positive control of the nuclear forces whether they be on land, in the air, or on/under the sea. Again, Harry performed his nuclear Command & Control duties flawlessly.

It should also be noted that Harry wore his uniform with absolute perfection. His pants and shirts had "military creases" exactly where they needed to be. In fact, Harry's appearance was flawless. He was the epitome of professionalism and was often complimented by his superiors for maintaining an outstanding dress and appearance standard.

As often happens in the US military, I lost touch with Harry when I was reassigned to another Air Force Base. I learned of Harry's passing through a Facebook Group and was shocked by the news. On behalf of the 1,400 members of the USAF Radio Operators (Past & Present) Facebook Group, I extend our heartfelt condolences to the family of Harry Beach.

I close with the opening stanzas of the poem "High Flight", and I hope they bring you solace as you grieve for your departed Airman,

Harry Beach:

*"Oh! I have slipped the surly bonds of Earth
And danced the skies on laughter-silvered wings;
Sunward I've climbed, and joined the tumbling mirth
of sun-split clouds,—and done a hundred things
You have not dreamed of..."*
