Horace Lavon Rodgers was born to the late Willie Alexander Rodgers and the late Mary Elizabeth Rodgers on April 23, 1955 and was called to eternal rest on Thursday, May 18, 2023.

Horace graduated from Bear Grass High School in 1973 and was accepted into North Carolina State University but decided electricity was his love. He got his start with W.H. Whitfield & Sons, but later went to work at Herrington Manufacturing Company. He then managed the family's farm for a while and finally was able to start his own electrical business, H.R. Rodgers Electric Contractors which he owned and operated for over forty years. During this time, he branched out into building construction where he built several churches, notably Cedar Hill Baptist Church, and other businesses. Horace had a sharp eye and great mind for detail and business. Horace also started a grave digging and a headstone business. Horace loved being in business for himself. Horace loved being the boss.

Horace joined Cedar Hill Missionary Baptist Church at an early age where he loved Vacation Bible School. He later became a Trustee of the church and co-chaired Men's Day on two occasions.

Horace was married to Lennell Stokes, Lashone Wallace, and Nedra Purvis.

To these unions no children were born, but he served a stepfather to nine. Although these marriages ended in divorce, Nedra and Horace remained friends until his death. Horace loved interacting with family and Thanksgiving was his favorite holiday. This was the time of the year the family came together at his sister and brother-in-law's home.

Horace loved Rodgers Town. He felt and acted like he owned the town. He declared himself the town's historian. If you wanted to know any Rodgers Town history, just ask Horace. He would ride around with the neighborhood seniors and learn all they had to offer. He even named his farm, Rodgers Town Farm.

Horace went through many health challenges. When his leg was amputated, he was determined not to walk with a cane or a walker. When his kidneys failed, he was determined not to go to a center for dialysis, he was determined to do home dialysis by himself. And after we brought him home after his first heart attack, he got back in his truck and went to work the next day. Horace set high goals for himself; he was a determined young man and never gave up.

Horace was preceded in death by his brother, Milford Rodgers and his sister, Dorothy Hickman.

Horace leaves to cherish his memories his sister, Ontra Reddick (Darnell) of Williamston, NC; three brothers, Samuel Rodgers of Williamston, NC, Johnny Rodgers of Raleigh, NC and Vernell (Cynthia) of Windsor, NC; one aunt, Margaret Howell of Williamston, NC, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
