Jobie Parker was born April 10, 1933 in Gold Point, NC to the late Jobie Parker and Rosie Black Parker. He was a product of a Christian home. Jobie came to Morristown in the 1960's and worked as a cook at Greystone Park Hospital in Morris Plains, NJ. He was later employed at Rogers' Clothes and then at Epstein's Department Store where he was a tailor until his retirement. At an early age, Jobie joined Willow Chapter Church, in Gold Point, North Carolina, and later moved to Morristown where he joined the Church of God in Christ for All Saints. He was a faithful member of the Usher Board, Gordon Rogers Senior Choir, Men's Choir, Men's Sunday School Class, Men's Fellowship, and was a driver/worker for Operation Love. He lovingly cared for the church for over 40 years a church custodian. Jobie was a man of prayer, dedicating his life to praying for the sick, the shut-in, and especially the children. He faithfully led the 8:00am Morning Prayer on each weekday. He remained faithful and loyal until his illness prevented him from attending church.
