Joyce Dixon was born on July 16, 1944 in Williamston, North Carolina to Lucy and Grover Dixon who both preceded her in death. She departed this life on Saturday, April-26th at Martin General Hospital.

Joyce was educated in the Martin County School system in North Carolina. She moved to New York in the sixties and was employed by the Marriot Hotel as well as several food processing companies, returning to Williamston in 2002.

Joyce accepted Christ at an early age, rededicating her life to Christ in 1986, she became a member of Healing From Heaven Ministries in New York City under the leadership of Pastor Leo Stallworth. There she was a member of the Adult Choir. After relocating to Williamston, she became a member of Faith Temple Church of God in Christ under Pastor Samuel Blount. health declined.

Joyce never gave up on life or on her God. She showed us all how to take life's challenges in stride.

Joyce loved cooking, never liking to cook a little of anything. For her it always had to be a

big pot and it had to be well seasoned. After she was unable to prepare her own foods, the

family still catered to her desires and someone was always taking her a "good" plate of food or

her favorite snacks. They knew she would refuse to eat what she called "plain food" -no

matter how nutritious it was.

Joyce was preceded in death by her daughter, Emma Mae Smith; brothers, Elton, James,

Larry, George.

She leaves to cherish her memories a daughter, Vernita Price of Greenville ,NC;

three sons, Elton Dixon (Keisha) and Terrence Weldon (Dorine) of Williamston, NC, Kinte
