On Thursday December 1, 2016 Lena Mae Bell Stancil departed her earthly life peacefully at Vidant Medical Center in Greenville N.C.

Lena Mae was born on November 29, 1942 one of eleven children to the late Thomas Bell, Sr. and Mary Jane Wiggins Bell in Martin County.

Lena Mae grew up in Oak City, NC on the Bell’s family farm and attended Martin County Public Schools.

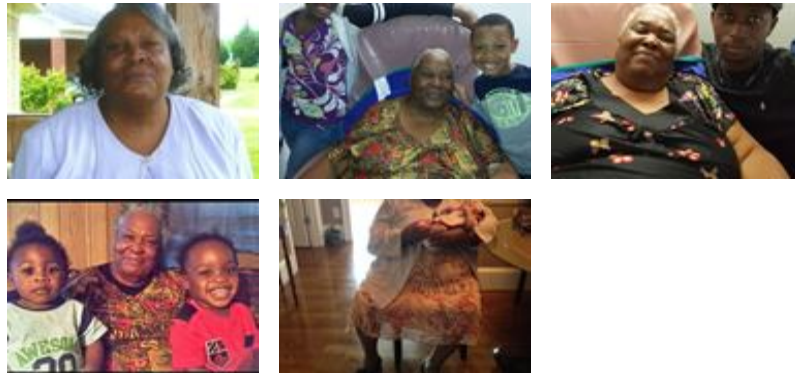
